Twelfth Annual Easter Cantata Choir Begins Rehearsals

Over 60 singers from the Sturgis area are beginning rehearsals for the 12th Annual Easter Cantata. The singers, along with Director Marlene Kotab, will celebrate the powerful moments leading up

to Easter at their two concerts on Palm Sunday, March 25 and Tuesday, March 27 at 7:00 p.m. at Grace Lutheran Church, 1061 Sherman in Sturgis. The concerts will be followed by receptions in the church basement. The cantata is once again sponsored by the Sturgis Area Arts Council and will be narrated by Randy Bender.

The 66-voice choir will perform Pepper Choplin's Come to the Cross and Remember. The piece chronicles Christ's journey to the cross. As the cantata progresses, the choir shares images connected to this journey – palms, the cup and the bread, the nail, the crown of thorns, and more. These images form the central theme of this cantata. Each image will be brought forward to create a very moving tableau. The audience will hear new choruses by Choplin such as The Messiah Has Come and You Will Be With Me in Paradise while still enjoying Lenten favorites such as Go to Dark Gethsemane.


No one should miss this community favorite presentation. The concerts are free to the public with an opportunity to freely donate at the door.


On Thursday, March 1st, which may be too late for this newsletter, the group will discuss "The Hare With Amber Eyes" by Edmund de Waal. This is a


The Sturgis Honor Guard is a group of hard-working volunteers that provide military funeral honors for our veterans at the Black Hills National Cemetery.

Godspell reappearing this summer



Sturgis thespians began producing musicals in the summer of 1999. To celebrate the 20th run of summer plays, the SAAC drama committee is planning a reprise of Godspell, 1999's first production. Based on the Gospel according to Matthew and Luke, Godspell is the first musical

theatre offering from composer Stephen Schwartz. Schwartz continued to write other well-known hits such as Wicked, Pippin, and Children of Eden. Godspell first opened off Broadway in 1971. Several albums featuring songs from the musical have been released over the years and "Day by Day," reached #13 on the Billboard pop singles chart in the summer of 1972. This international hit, as well as an eclectic blend of songs ranging from pop to vaudeville, help play out Jesus' life onstage. The 70's style music is set to lyrics from other more traditional hymns but is definitely considered non-traditional.

The cast is composed of a comedic troupe who team up with Jesus as they present a series of parables, mostly written in the Gospel of Matthew, but three recorded only in the Gospel of Luke. Even after the crucifixion scene, Jesus' message of kindness, tolerance, and love continues to shine. Jesus and John the Baptist/Judas are the leading male parts, but the troupe will include both male and female actors high school age and older.

Auditions are set for May 6-7 from 6:00-8:00pm. The location will be forthcoming. The musical will play from June 21-25 at the Sturgis Community Center and will be directed by June Dill. Any help from the community with costumes and/or set will be appreciated. You may call Marlene Kotab at 347-1375 to volunteer.




