GODSPELL returns to the Sturgis stage

The Sturgis Area Arts Council's Drama Committee is proud to celebrate its 20th season of summer musicals with its presentation of "Godspell", a reprise of our first show, which was originally produced in 1999.

Auditions for this summer's reprise of Godspell will be held on Sunday, May 6th and Monday, May 7th from 6:00-8:00pm both evenings at Grace Lutheran Church, located at 1061 Sherman Street in Sturgis.

All actors/singers high school age and above are welcome to audition. No advance preparation is necessary. You will be asked to sing music that will be provided at the audition. College students who can't make the audition may call Director June Dill at 347-1623 or Jen Loftin at 490-1125 before May 5th to make other audition arrangements.



Rehearsals will begin Tuesday, May 8th from 6:30-8:30pm and will continue on Monday -Thursday evenings until the week of the show. Minimal absences are necessary and we encourage you to check your schedule for any conflicts before auditioning.

The Cast is composed of a comedic troupe who team up with Jesus as they present a series of parables based on the Gospels according to Matthew and Luke. Godspell is the first musical theatre offering from composer Stephen Schwartz. Jesus and John the Baptist/Judas are the leading male parts, but the troupe will include both male and female actors.

To celebrate the 20th season, a reception will be held at the Saturday, June 23rd, performance.

BHAA is made up of both amateur and professional artists from the northern Black Hills and surrounding area, who work in a variety of media including painting, sculpture, fiber art, and photography. The group meets at Spearfish Chamber of Commerce on the first Saturday of every month, except July and August. Demonstrations and workshops are given by members, and also by guest artists from outside the group.

BHAA holds displays of artwork at various public places, including the Sturgis Library June 2-30. Each summer, the members take a field trip to a site of artistic interest in our area. This day of fun often includes plein air painting and
