One Book SD

The South Dakota Humanities Council has chosen "Informing the News, the Need for Knowledge-based Journalism" by Thomas E. Patterson as the One Book SD for 2018. SAAC is pleased to offer a discussion of this book on Tuesday, September 11, 2018 at 7 PM in the program room of the Sturgis Public Library. Humanities Scholar Molly Barari will lead the discussion. Copies of the book will be available to borrow at the Sturgis Public Library by the middle of August.

Thomas E. Patterson is Bradlee Professor of Government and the Press at the Harvard Kennedy School and is the award-winning author of Out of Order, whose research has been funded by several prominent foundations. He is a graduate of South Dakota State University and earned his PhD from the University of Minnesota in 1971.

In this book, Patterson proposes "knowledge-based journalism" as a corrective for the lack of a "steady supply of trustworthy and relevant news," necessary to a healthy democracy as advocated by journalist Walter Lippmann nearly a century ago. It is directed to all citizens concerned about the integrity of the news.

Discussion leader, Molly Barari earned her MFA in Creative Writing in 2017. A native of Kearney, NE, she teaches creative writing through Community Education of the Black Hills and is a freelance teacher and marketer. She lives in Rapid City with her husband of five years, David Barari.

Watercolor painting is a favorite medium of Newman's but she also enjoys watercolor and ink, acrylics, pencil and has recently added working with watercolor pencils and colored pencils. Her pieces include landscapes, still life and modern art.

Art is originally created by nature. I am so inspired by its beauty and intricate design, for example a lone tree, a stormy sky or a bird's wings, that I am often moved to express my interaction with it visually.

Bill Feteral (our July Artist) is a SD native living near Deadwood. He has lived in the western part of the state since he was a 2nd grader. It was then that he learned that he could draw. While watching a




fellow student sketching on a piece of paper, he was encouraged to do the same, with some success.


