#### Artists of the Month



Our January Artists are the Art Students of the Stagebarn Middle School. Their work will be on display at the Sturgis Public Library in January.

Our February Artists are the Sturgis Brown High School Art Students. Here's a bit about them:

The Sturgis Brown High School Art Department, under the direction of art teachers DeVee Dietz and Anna Tescher, will display a variety of 2-D and 3-D artworks from the Introduction to the visual arts, Art1/Photo1, and the 3D Sculpture classes during the month of February.

The Visual Arts provides opportunities for students to create a wide variety of original artwork through various mediums and resources while developing problem solving and innovative thinking skills. The courses help students understand what drawing is and its purposes. Students utilize the elements and principles of design in their planning and production of art.

Projects on display include:

Introduction to Visual Arts Classes: Line Design, Realistic Animal Sketches, Scratch Art, Drawings, Abstract Expressionism, Triptych of Color Schemes Paintings.

Art 1/Photo 1 Class: Scratch Art, Perspective Art Museum

3D Sculpture Class: Pottery, Giacometti Sculptures, "7 Deadly Sins" Chicken Wire Sculptures

In the many courses provided to the students at SBHS, students have the opportunity to recognize the important influences the arts have on our daily lives, learn how to appreciate many art forms, aesthetic awareness, and discover an outlet for personal expression.

### Colcannon bringing Irish Cheer!!!


