Coronavirus Halts Christmas Concert

When the COVID-19 concert cancellation cascade started in early March, members of the SAAC board voted to cancel the Easter Cantata. Then as time passed, the Drama Committee deemed it pointless to continue plans to hold the scheduled summer musical, "9 to 5". No concert-goer could have imagined the pandemic would continue to influence closings and cancellations well into December. But SAAC finds itself in the position of doing just that with the cancellation of its 42nd Annual Community Christmas Concert.

This annual concert was postponed once or twice in its 41-year history. But, unlike 2020, the concert was only delayed one week because of inclement weather. This year the concert is cancelled because of a storm, but not a storm that is as shortlived as a blizzard. Despite a hope for "getting back to normal," SAAC has concluded that it would not be safe (nor possible) to hold the concert. No choirs are producing beautiful music in local churches and after evaluating the safety for singers and audience, it is our conclusion that if just one person walked out of the Community Center Theater with COVID-19, we would not be able to forgive ourselves.

Thanks to all who have continued to support SAAC and the arts in Sturgis. We look forward to a time of celebration when we present the 2021 concert!




